Dear Friends


How did you find Lent this year? Were you able to stick to the things you had planned to give up or take on? I suspect some of us find it easier than others but nonetheless, I wonder if your Lenten journey has inspired and encouraged you to continue with that particular thing into Easter and beyond? I know that has often been my experience - sometimes with seemingly unimportant things (eg giving up sugar in hot drinks, which I did when I was about 11) and sometimes with things that have seemed more spiritually nourishing (eg regularly spending time prayer journalling).

And if things didn't go quite as you'd hoped or planned over Lent, Easter is always a great time to make a new start as we are so powerfully reminded of the forgiveness, new life and transformation made possible by Jesus.

As we await the findings of the TCC Circuit Review, I find myself wondering in what ways and in what areas might God be inviting BMC to make a new start? And in what areas might God be encouraging us to keep on keeping on, even if there doesn't seem to be much sign of new life at the moment? Let's keep paying attention to the green shoots that might be tentatively peeping through, as we remember and celebrate "Now the green blade rises from the buried grain ... Love lives again, that with the dead has been: Love is come again, like wheat that springs up green." (John Macleod Campbell Crum, STF 306)

I hope you continue to have a very happy and blessed Easter season.

Charity Updates

All We Can - The Christmas card board for BMC members was displayed in the welcome area and supported the work of All We Can raising £161.20

Self Help Africa - (Formerly known as Harvest Help) Geoff Barnard has sent the charity further donations from the sale of his book "Memoirs".

Christian Aid - Now only have a regional digital group (Facebook) which BMC will start to follow. It will enable us to flag up future updates or campaigns. BMC will continue to support CA week each May, through communion giving and display a CA banner to remind the wider community.

Action for Children - The BMC Christmas collections totalled $\pounds 451.50$. The Home Collecting Box total for 2023 was $\pounds 170.88$. Further other one-off fundraising has been put on hold.

Maggie's Cancer Support Unit - Chris Hartley is on track to achieve her total of £2,800 raised for Maggie's by August 2024. She has suggested hosting an afternoon tea event in the community hub (date TBC), with a speaker from Maggie's to share an insight into the range of services and support available.

Eco Church - BMC continues to be part of the Stockport Climate Action Network (CAN) and Bramhall's Green Network. Sarah recently attended the Stockport CAN meeting and heard a presentation relating to a harmful weed killer, still being used by Stockport MBC. Alison recently attended the Bramhall Green Network meeting and pledged that BMC would take part in the #showthelove campaign during February and display green hearts, to show our support and care for nature and the climate.

Compassion - No updates but a number of BMC members continue to sponsor children through the charity.

BMC updates - Links with the wider community

The Coffee Shop continues to be popular with the local community of Bramhall but the number of available helpers remains a constant concern with last minute calls for assistance/swaps being a time consuming added responsibility.

The Thrift Shop is thriving but Margaret highlighted the need for new volunteers. Three members of staff have recently stepped down and there is an urgent requirement for a regular Friday afternoon volunteer, plus others to join the standby list.

In October 2023 - £8,000 was donated to charities nominated as usual, by the team of shop volunteers.

Each charity received £1,000 with the exception of Copperdale who received £2,000 (Please click on/see the links to read more about each charity).

Need to advertise for new volunteers in the Coffee Shop and Thrift Shop.

Repair Café – BMC have now been providing the rooms for Sustainable Bramhall to host their monthly event for a year. The Repair Café is growing in popularity and always provide statistics on their social media sites of the repairs after each event. Here is a copy of their post following the event held on 3rd Feb 2024:

"Thank you to all our visitors and repairers. Sewing was busy including repair of child's seam on their school coat, hole in jumper mended, Child's dressing up princess dress seam mended.

Two broken suit cases mended. Lamps, toaster, kettles, hair straighteners, radio, all repaired or faulty part identified to be returned next cafe with the new part to complete repair. And Digital radio pre-sets set up for elderly lady, and explained how she can do it herself if needed...hopefully.

There were a total of 25 repairs. Items repaired represented a saving of an equivalent of 630.4 kgs CO₂ emissions from not having to manufacture, transport, etc replacement products; and prevented 44.0 kgs of materials going to landfill. The CO₂ emissions equivalent saving is for driving an average petrol car 1803 miles."

Foodbank initiative/ Worker Bee Markets

Jo Fletcher reported that Moss Hey Primary School held a collection in January 2024 and the donations were all taken to Hope Central by one of the school governors. Donations continue to be delivered from BMC to Hope Central and Brownley Green, Wythenshawe on a monthly basis.

Worker Bee Markets – The meeting decided not to take up the offer of free charity space at the five worker bee markets during 2024 (for Foodbank collections).

Following the relocation of Sainsbury's from the precinct, donations dropped off dramatically during 2023. It was concluded that the volunteers' time and efforts would be more usefully engaged in other activities.

It was agreed that a stall could be set up and

made available within Church, at specific events, and it was the right time to seek approval from Resources to purchase an all-weather outdoor drop off "bin" for donations.

Links to Wythenshawe

There was an excellent response by BMC members to the Warm Fund appeal before Christmas, which provided Rev Dave Warnock with funds to top up pre-paid meters for needy households, known to him, over the coldest weeks of winter.

The idea to bring a gift of a selection box to the Nativity service was also a welcome initiative which boasted the seasonal treats for families in Wythenshawe. There is now also a steady stream of household goods and clothes being delivered each month. These are mainly distributed directly to needy families or sold in Mo's Cabin, St Andrew's Church (Emmaus Emporium). Unsold items are sent to the Lawton Moor monthly rummage sale.

Action – Jo and Alison to produce a strategic plan for ongoing support to Wythenshawe on a yearround seasonal basis. For example, feeding families during school holidays, preparing for next winter, exploring new options.

Bitesize Church - Colshaw

(Bitesize Church is being established as a "New Place for New People," Caleb community.) Sarah reported that there weren't quite as many guests at the February meeting, with a mix of regular attendees and new ones. Good links are being established with the Tenants & Residents association and there is a good stable team of volunteers from BMC. One of the regular guests has now taken ownership for tea/coffee prep.

Shoebox Appeal

Work is now beginning on this project for 2024 and will run throughout the year, with a drop off, collection place made available on the Church premises.


